Recognizing Older Americans Month – May 2017

May is recognized each year as Older Americans Month. In May, the Vermont Department of Disabilities, Aging and Independent Living (DAIL) and the five Area Agencies on Aging recognize the importance of Older Americans Act programs in keeping older Vermonters healthy and at home as well as honor the older Vermonters in our communities whose hard work, years of experience and energy are helping build momentum for a strong and vibrant Vermont for years to come.

While most everyone has heard talk of Vermont's changing demographics, fewer are aware of the quiet but dedicated network of organizations, community groups and volunteers coordinating and providing essential services to older Vermonters across the state. I am talking about supports like home delivered meals, care coordination, and caregiver support, bringing both skilled experts and neighborhood volunteers to people's homes to support them with everything from good nutrition to quality daily care to family respite. I am talking about countless collaborations in community, such as Memory Cafes for individuals with dementia and their care partners, Tai Chi classes at senior centers promoting lifelong health and wellness, and transportation networks, helping people access activities and engage in their communities even if they no longer drive. DAIL is extremely grateful to the many organizations and individuals across our state whose dedicated efforts are helping us all to stay as healthy and independent as we can while we age.

Older Americans Month is also a time to reflect on how perceptions of aging change over time, both for individuals as we age ourselves, and for the culture and communities around us. While my young children may tell me I'm old, and I admit I may have said the same to my mother when I was their age, I certainly don't feel old. But what is "old"? The fact is, we are all aging every day. Like birth and death, we all have this in common. But how we get older, and how we are able to face both the challenges and opportunities that come with aging, varies not only based on our own perceptions and personal choices, but depends to a large extent on the social systems, supports, and structures that surround us. For example, the experience of

aging can be very different between the rural Northeast Kingdom and downtown Burlington. As we become an older state and nation, it is critical that we be proactive in considering what systemic change is needed so that all Vermonters may live long, healthy and happy lives. Do we have enough affordable and accessible housing for people of all incomes, abilities, and ages? Do we have an adequate healthcare workforce and integrated healthcare systems to connect services across the care continuum so that everyone receives high quality care and support in all settings? Do we have communities with thriving businesses employing older workers, robust transportation options, strong volunteer networks, and engaging activities for all ages?

There is much to consider as we envision a Vermont that truly embraces aging at a systems level, and with growing demand amid limited resources, the challenges are very real. But I remain optimistic, because I know that Vermonters are not daunted by challenge. We are a community of problem-solvers. With a willingness to start the conversation and then do the hard work, we can find smart and innovative solutions to create the kind of world we all want to grow older in. Let's start now.

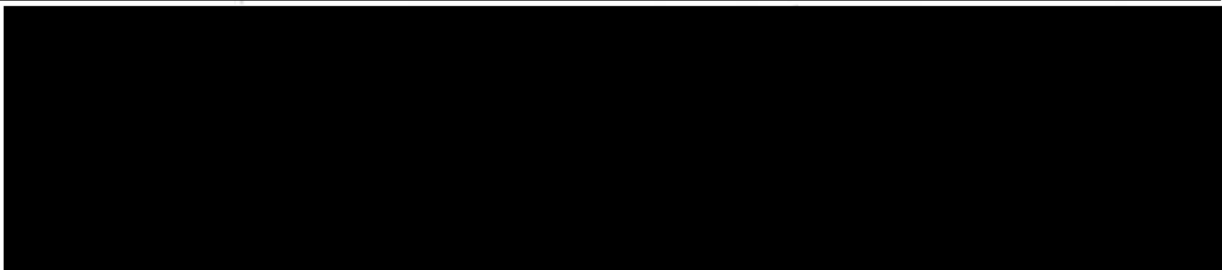
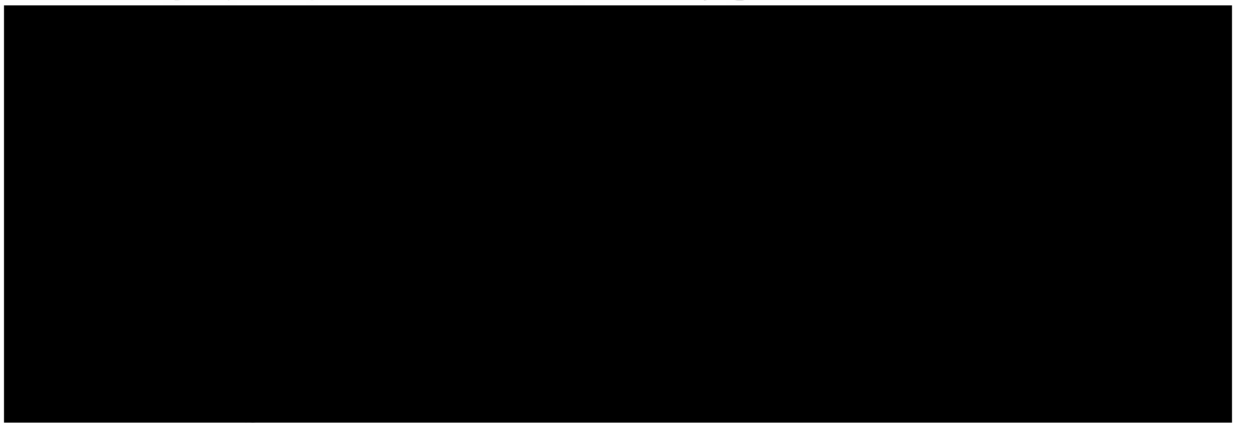

Please take a look at the CMS comment below. I believe that CMS is disagreeing with scoring in the TBI Systemic Assessment (bottom of p.11/top of p.12).

For the TBI waiver, the state assessed its state policies and regulations as compliant with the federal requirement that a setting ensure an individual's rights of privacy, dignity, respect, and freedom from coercion and restraint. CMS found that the statutory provisions, and some of the regulations and policy documents cited by the state are compliant with the requirement to ensure rights to privacy, dignity, and respect and freedom from coercion but non-compliant for the requirement of freedom from restraint because restraint is allowed without incorporating 42 CFR 441.301(c)(viii)(A) through (H).).

Sorry to pick this up so late – but we are going to need a draft response that addresses this issue before the end of the day so I would appreciate any/all thoughts.

A Comprehensive Quality Strategy (CQS) is a CMS required document for all states implementing Managed Care in its Medicaid Program. The Vermont CQS Outline serves as a blueprint or road map for Vermont and its public Managed Care Organization in assessing the quality of care that beneficiaries receive, as well as for setting forth measurable goals and targets for improvement.

Driver Diagram - The Global Commitment to Health (GC) driver diagram is a tool used to display the components of Vermont's improvement efforts in its Medicaid Program (via the waiver), as well as, to communicate the waiver's theory of change. The driver diagram displays the goals of the waiver, identifies their drivers, shows how the drivers are connected, and ultimately provides the basis for how Vermont will measure its performance relative to the goals.

HCBS Systemic Assessments - These documents assess the existing Vermont regulations and standards related to HCBS delivery to determine if they meet the federal HCBS final rule requirements. Items are scored as alignment, partial alignment, silent, or non-compliant. All items that do not receive a score of alignment are subject to remediation or corrective action plans and included on the associated Work Plan.

HCBS Work Plans - These documents expand upon the System Assessments by identifying subsequent action steps for the Vermont regulations and standards that did not receive a score of alignment. The action step must resolve the identified issue and bring the Vermont regulation and/or standard into alignment with the federal HCBS final rule.

HCBS Surveys: Consumer Validation and Site Specific Setting Assessment - Surveys available at this link were used by the state of Vermont to assess specific settings in which home and community-based services (HCBS)

GAO Issues Report on Medicaid HCBS The Government Accountability Office (GAO) report examines states' approaches to assessing individual needs for Medicaid home- and community-based services (HCBS). It recommends that CMS require states to address potential for conflicts of interest in conducting assessments.

"... The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has taken steps to improve needs assessments but concerns about conflict of interest remain in regard to HCBS providers and managed care plans. HCBS providers may have a financial interest in the outcome of needs assessments, which could lead to overstating needs and overprovision of services. CMS has addressed risks associated with HCBS provider conflicts, such as by requiring states to establish standards for conducting certain needs assessments, but these requirements do not cover all types of HCBS programs. For example, specific conflict of interest requirements are generally not in place for needs assessments that are used to inform HCBS eligibility determinations. In addition, requirements for states to establish standards to address HCBS providers' potential for conflict of interest in conducting needs assessments that are used for service planning do not apply across all programs.

...
Similarly, managed care plans may have a financial interest in the outcome of HCBS assessments used for both determining eligibility and service amounts. Managed care plans could have an incentive to enroll beneficiaries with few needs, as plans typically receive a fixed payment per enrollee. For example, a plan in one state admitted in a settlement with the federal government to enrolling 1,740 individuals, from 2011 through 2013, whose needs did not qualify them. In 2013, CMS issued guidance that managed care plans may not be involved in assessments used to determine eligibility for HCBS, but CMS has not consistently required states to prevent this involvement. Among three states GAO reviewed with managed care HCBS programs, CMS required one to stop allowing plans to conduct such assessments but allowed plan involvement in two states. The absence of conflict-of-interest requirements across all types of HCBS programs and states is not consistent with federal internal control standards, which require agencies to respond to risks to program objectives."

The HIS contains data elements that are used by the CMS to calculate these measures and also allows CMS to collect quality data from hospices in compliance with Section 3004 of the Affordable Care Act. 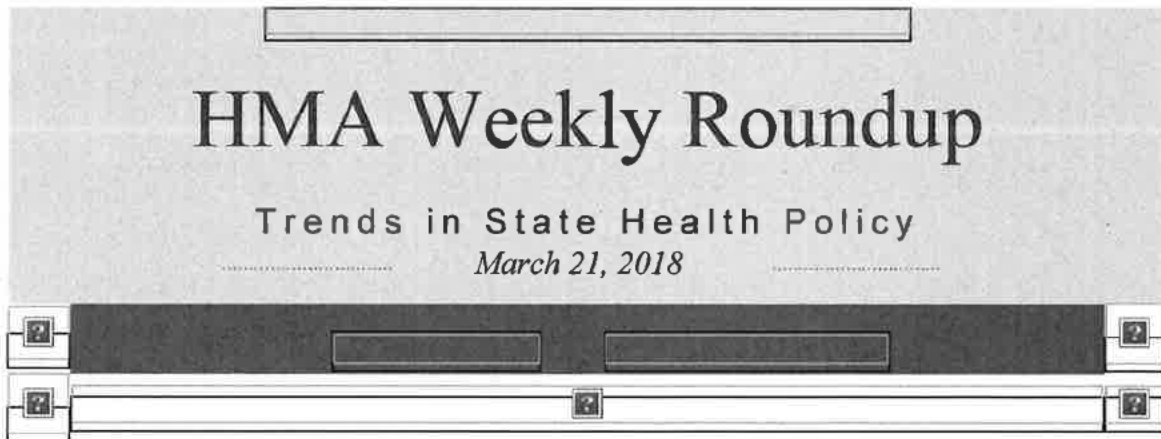

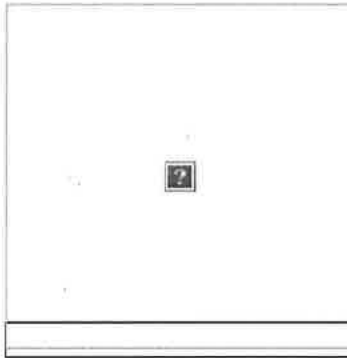

A final determination on whether some activities included in Column B are allowable or not hasn't been made on all. Some agencies responded with activities not currently under the definition but they felt should be.

I also attached a list of the agency responses in the second page of the spreadsheet. These responses are slightly more difficult to categorize because agencies appear to have blended 2 different categories of services: 1.) activities the agency billed for, but couldn't report to the MSR 2.) activities not currently funded, but which the agency has to do, such as approving timesheets, developing trainings, checking background checks etc. for which there is no cost center. We wanted to make sure you were aware of **two critical pieces of information that CMS released this morning on Medicaid.gov**.

1. An informational bulletin addressing the findings of the OIG/OCR/ACL Joint Report on state oversight of group homes that was issued in January. In the CIB, CMS urges states to review the recommendations included in the report and incorporate them into their critical incident management and quality assurance processes. We've attached both the CIB and the Joint Report for ease of reference.
2. Instructions and the necessary content that a state should include in its application for the 'good-faith' exemption for a 1-year delay in the EVV compliance deadline for personal care services that goes into effect on January 1, 2019. Only one request may be filed by a state between July 1 – November 30, 2018. We have attached the instructions here as well.

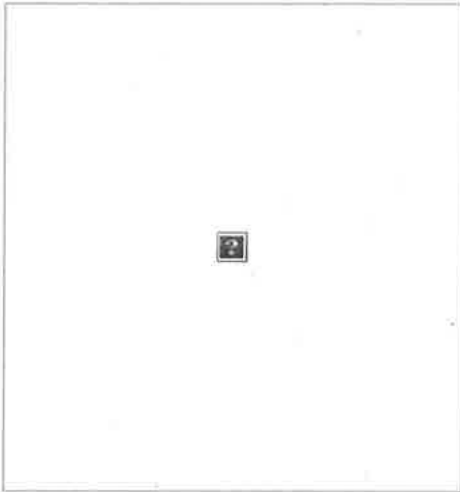

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Long-term services and supports (LTSS) enable more than 12 million people, including older adults and adults and children with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD), physical disabilities, and mental health conditions, among other conditions, to meet their personal care needs and live with dignity and independence in a variety of community and institutional settings. With LTSS expenditures of more than \$140 billion annually, Medicaid is the single leading payer of these critical services. The aging population's projected growth—18 percent by 2020 and doubling by 2060—will only increase demand for LTSS and in turn, put more pressure on Medicaid at both the federal and state levels. As a result of these demographic and fiscal challenges that make the status quo untenable, as well as federal policy and funding priorities, states are seeking to reform their Medicaid LTSS systems to both improve the quality of care for beneficiaries and contain program costs. There is no one way to implement LTSS, and the Medicaid program offers multiple approaches for designing person-centered services and opportunities for states to shape their strategies to address local needs and state-specific constraints. For states at an earlier stage of reform, the LTSS reform strategies adopted by state innovators offer important lessons. This toolkit highlights several strategies that states are using to deliver high-quality and high-value LTSS in two key areas: (1) rebalancing LTSS to increase the proportion of LTSS provided in community-based settings and (2) integrating LTSS with physical and behavioral health services through managed care. The toolkit is intended to assist states in identifying concrete policy and programmatic strategies, operational steps, and available federal and state authorities in these LTSS reform areas, as well as the reasons why states have utilized different strategies and the challenges they have faced in designing and implementing these reforms. For each strategy identified within the rebalancing and integration sections, we provide: the impetus, a description, potential implementation mechanisms, results to date, and key lessons. We also offer case studies to illustrate how states have implemented each strategy. The

strategies can be mixed and matched, sequenced in different ways, and modified to accommodate state preferences. Reforming LTSS is a journey, with tangible and meaningful gains achieved along the way.

Rebalancing LTSS

Since the beginning of the Medicaid program, states were required to guarantee nursing facility services to eligible individuals, but most home- and community-based services (HCBS) (e.g., case management and personal care services) were optional and, for many years, the federal authorities and level of federal funding for HCBS were limited. Though HCBS continues to be optional, changes in federal laws and state-initiated actions—driven by individual and family preferences, state interest, legal obligations and the relative cost-effectiveness of providing care in the community—have led to a dramatic increase in the proportion of LTSS provided in community-based settings. Today, 55 percent of Medicaid LTSS spending supports HCBS compared to just 18 percent in 1995. And yet, these proportions vary significantly across states, as well as across populations who use LTSS. The toolkit highlights the following three strategies that states have relied on to increase the proportion of LTSS spending for services provided in community settings and illustrative case studies for each strategy, as well as an overarching case study on Maryland’s rebalancing efforts (see Section II):

Strategy 1: Develop LTSS System Infrastructure to Promote Greater Access to HCBS, which focuses on ways states

are enhancing their LTSS system infrastructure, access points and direct care workforce, as well as supporting informal caregivers. Case studies include:

- **Massachusetts’** creation of a one-stop information and referral network and expansion of HCBS access;
- **California’s** implementation of paid family leave to support family LTSS caregivers;
- **New York’s** development of a uniform assessment system to standardize HCBS needs assessments;
- **New York’s** use of 1115 waiver funds to recruit, and retain its long-term care direct care workers;
- **New Jersey’s** nurse delegation pilot to increase access to HCBS; and
- **Tennessee’s** LTSS workforce strategy.

Strategy 2: Invest in Programs and Services that Help Nursing Facility Residents Return to and Remain in

Their Communities, which focuses on investments in transition services and tenancy-sustaining services and, in particular,

affordable housing options. Case studies include:

- **New York’s** 1915(c) waiver to divert and transition Medicaid enrollees from nursing facilities;
- **Texas’** *Money Follows the Person* behavioral health pilot to enhance benefits for people with serious mental illness to support their community transitions;
- **Arizona** and **Texas’** decisions to leverage federal and state funding and private sector development to provide housing

supports to individuals with disabilities exiting institutions; and

- **Tennessee's** transition of individuals from nursing facilities to the community.

Strategy 3: Expand Access to HCBS for “Pre-Medicaid” Individuals to Prevent or Delay Nursing Facility Use,

which focuses on expanding access to a limited set of HCBS for people who would not otherwise qualify for Medicaid to slow their likely future need for more expensive Medicaid LTSS, including institutional services. Case studies include:

- **Washington's** use of an 1115 waiver to expand access to services for individuals at-risk of needing LTSS; and
- **Vermont's** use of an 1115 waiver to expand HCBS to people at-risk of needing intensive LTSS.

Integrating LTSS through Managed Care

While the majority of Medicaid beneficiaries nationwide are now enrolled in managed care, the same does not hold true for Medicaid beneficiaries who use LTSS, including those eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid (“dually eligible beneficiaries”) and those with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). Instead, many states have kept LTSS beneficiaries in fee-for service arrangements, in part based on beneficiary and family concerns about ensuring continued access to critical non-medical services and supports, and health plans’ limited experience with LTSS generally and HCBS in particular. More recently, though, the potential benefits of managed care—namely reducing care fragmentation, delivering person-centered and community based care, improving health outcomes, and reducing overall program costs—have been recognized and increasingly, states have added LTSS to their managed care delivery strategies. These efforts—often undertaken cautiously to address beneficiary and other stakeholder concerns—offer best practices and lessons learned about program design and implementation, stakeholder engagement, internal capacity, and program evaluation. The toolkit highlights the following three strategies in this area, as well as illustrative case studies, for integrating LTSS with physical and behavioral health services (see Section III):

Strategy 1: Integrate Medicare-Medicaid Benefits for Dually Eligible Beneficiaries, which focuses on aligning

Medicare and Medicaid financing and care delivery. Case studies include:

- **Arizona** and **New Jersey's** paths toward alignment; and
- Aligning administrative processes for **Minnesota's** Senior Health Options (MSHO) program beneficiaries.

Strategy 2: Integrate Comprehensive Care for Medicaid-Only Beneficiaries under Capitated

Managed Care,

which focuses on providing a comprehensive benefit package, including physical and behavioral health services and LTSS under

a single capitated rate and coordinated delivery system. The case study highlights:

- **Virginia's** Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus program that integrates all LTSS, medical, and behavioral health services under one program for Medicaid-only beneficiaries.

Strategy 3: Enroll Individuals with I/DD in Managed Care, which focuses on the different ways states are approaching

the transition of individuals with I/DD to managed care. The case study highlights:

- **New York's** 1115 waiver that creates care coordination organizations to integrate primary care, behavioral health, and social support services with LTSS for the I/DD population.

Hi Shawn,

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself and to inform you that I will be working with you on the STP moving forward.

As a follow up to your initial approval, please see below additional CMS feedback to assist the state with final approval of the STP. Please let us know when you are available to discuss any questions or concerns you might have. Also please share this email with any other members of your team who may need it.

[PLEASE NOTE: It is anticipated that the state will need to go out for public comment once these changes are made and prior to resubmitting to CMS for consideration of final approval. The state is requested to provide a timeline and anticipated date for resubmission as soon as possible.]

Date of STP Submission: 11/30/2017

Person-Centered Planning

CMS requests the state clarify in the CQS that Person-Centered Planning criteria do not have a phase-in allowance; these criteria were effective March 17, 2014.

Site-Specific Settings Assessment Process

- The STP is silent regarding the number of settings to be assessed for each service population group with the exception of Developmental Disability Services. Please provide the total number of settings subject to the HCBS Settings Rule by specialized service population group.
- ***Group Non-residential Settings: As a reminder, any setting in which individuals are clustered or grouped together for the purposes of receiving HCBS must be assessed and validated by the state for compliance with the rule. This includes all group residential and non-residential settings (including but not limited to prevocational services, group supported employment and group day habilitation activities). The state may presume that any setting where individualized services are being provided in typical community settings comport with the rule.*** The STP indicates that except for limited instances found in the DDS service system, the state does not support disability specific or segregated day treatment centers or programs. ***Please confirm that the STP accurately includes all group residential and non-residential settings in its assessment and validation activities.***
- ***Provider Self-Assessment Surveys:*** The state has developed electronic surveys and provided links to the survey tools. The STP does not provide information regarding the state's strategy to ensure each setting has completed a self-assessment. The STP states "To increase the response rate, a process will be created to follow-up with providers failing to meet requested response timeframes. Based on the results of the survey, an authorized

representative of each provider will attest in writing whether they believe that their organization's rules and policies are either fully compliant with the new rules or that remediation is necessary (p.13)."

- Please confirm in the STP that providers completed a distinct self-assessment for each individual setting providing Medicaid-funded HCBS.
- Please confirm the self-assessment process evaluates the experience of individual's receiving HCBS in each setting.
- **Individual, Private Homes:** The state may make the presumption that privately-owned or rented homes and apartments of people living with family members, friends, or roommates meet the HCBS settings criteria if they are integrated in typical community neighborhoods where people who do not receive HCBS also reside. A state will generally not be required to verify this presumption. However, the state must outline what it will do to monitor compliance of this category of settings with the regulatory criteria over time. Note, settings where the beneficiary lives in a private residence owned by an unrelated caregiver (who is paid for providing HCBS services to the individual) are considered provider-owned or controlled settings and should be evaluated as such.

Validation of HCBS Settings

States are responsible for assuring that all HCBS settings comply with the settings criteria. States may use a combination of various strategies to assure that each setting is properly validated (including but not limited to state onsite visits; data collection on beneficiary experiences and consumer feedback; leveraging of existing case management, licensing & certification, and quality management review processes; partnerships with other federally-funded state entities, including but not limited to Developmental Disability and aging networks; and state review of data from operational entities, such as managed care organizations (MCOs) or regional boards/entities, provider policies, consumer surveys, and feedback from external stakeholders), so long as compliance with each individual setting is validated by at least one methodology beyond the provider self-assessment.

The STP indicates the state will develop a plan to validate the results of the provider-specific self-assessment during Phase 2 due 12/31/16. "At this time, the state plans to validate the results using a mixed-methods approach – using consumer survey as well as data from related oversight and monitoring activities that use a variety of desk and onsite review methodologies and tools (p. 12)."

- Please include additional details in the STP about the state's plan to validate the provider self-assessments, and how the state will assure that each setting providing Medicaid-funded HCBS will be assessed and validated, using at least one independent validation strategy.
- Please provide information in the STP about the state's plan for site visits, including the number of settings to receive site visits and when and how they will occur.

Reporting of Setting Validation Results: Once the state's validation activities have been completed, please provide an updated chart of the number of sites falling into categories of compliance (fully compliant with the settings criteria, could come into full compliance with modifications, cannot comply with the federal settings criteria, or are presumptively institutional in nature).

Remediation Strategies

- **Site-Specific Remediation:** The STP indicates that "Providers that indicate that remediation is necessary will be required to submit a Corrective Action Plan to the State within 30 days of submission of the provider self-assessment. The State will work with providers, through a corrective action process, to improve the quality of care and the setting characteristics to

align with State and federal HCBS standards (p. 13).” Please provide the following additional information:

- Describe the process that the state will take to assure that any discrepancies between the consumer responses and/or other validation strategy and provider self-assessments are addressed.
- Describe in more detail what state strategies will be employed to support site-specific remediation.
- Describe the process the state will employ to track progress with site-specific corrective action plans to ensure HCBS settings will achieve compliance by the March 2022 deadline.

Communication with and Support to Beneficiaries when a Provider will not be Compliant

Please provide a detailed strategy for assisting participants receiving services from providers not willing or able to come into compliance by the end of the transition period. CMS asks that Vermont include the following details of this process in the state’s next installation of its STP:

- Please include a timeline and a description of the processes for assuring that beneficiaries, through the person-centered planning process, will be given the opportunity, the information and the supports necessary to make an informed choice among options for continued service provision, including in an alternate setting that aligns, or will align by the end of the transition period, with the regulation. CMS requests that this description and timeline specifically explain how the state intends to assure beneficiaries that they will be provided sufficient communication and support including options among compliant settings, and assurance that there will be no disruption of services during the transition period.
- Please provide an estimate of the number of individuals who may need assistance in this regard.

Non-Disability Specific Settings: Please provide clarity on the manner in which the state will ensure that beneficiaries have access to services in non-disability specific settings among their service options for both residential and non-residential services. The STP should also indicate the steps the state is taking to build capacity among providers to increase access to non-disability specific setting options across home and community-based services.

Ongoing Monitoring of Settings

The STP indicates “The state will monitor progress on Corrective Action Plans and will also begin routine monitoring of compliance with the requirements of the new rules during the Transition period for providers for whom no Corrective Action Plan is in effect. *Monitoring of compliance with the HCBS Final Rule will occur long after the March 17, 2019, federal implementation date. On an ongoing basis, the state will ensure effective monitoring of provider settings to support continued compliance with all applicable HCB settings requirements. The Vermont Managed Care Entity (MCE) will have primary operational responsibility for monitoring, with oversight from AHS and an External Quality Review Organization. MCE staff will monitor member experience and compliance with HCB settings requirements by modifying its current monitoring/oversight tools to include the new HCBS requirements.* If the MCE identifies a compliance issue during a review, the provider will be notified of the issue and remediation measures will be taken, including but not limited to the development of a CAP, to address the issue. The provider will submit periodic updates to the MCE on the status of implementation. AHS and an External Quality Review Organization will be responsible for overseeing the MCE and will ensure that they adhere to all applicable CMS guidance (page 15). “

- Please add information on the estimated timeframes for implementing each element of the

oversight and monitoring plan.

Heightened Scrutiny

As a reminder, the state must clearly lay out its process for identifying settings that are presumed to have the qualities of an institution. These are settings for which the state must submit information for the heightened scrutiny process if the state determines, through its assessments, that these settings do have qualities that are home and community-based in nature and do not have the qualities of an institution. If the state determines it will not submit information, the institutional presumption will stand and the state must describe the process for determining next steps for the individuals involved. Please only submit those settings under heightened scrutiny that the state believes will overcome any institutional characteristics and can comply with the federal settings criteria. There are state examples of heightened scrutiny processes available upon request, as well as several tools and sub-regulatory guidance on this topic available online at <http://www.medicaid.gov/HCBS>.

- Please include further details about the criteria or deciding factors that will be used consistently across reviewers to make a final determination regarding whether or not to move a setting forward to CMS for heightened scrutiny review.

Milestones

A milestone template has been completed by CMS with timelines identified in the STP and has been sent to the state for review. CMS requests that the state review the information in the template and send the updated document to CMS. The chart should reflect anticipated milestones for completing systemic remediation, settings assessment and remediation, heightened scrutiny, communications with beneficiaries and ongoing monitoring of compliance.



To date, much of the focus has been on incorporating and implementing the new HCBS regulations related to the setting requirement and person centered approaches for service planning. Hi All,

Below was the agenda for today's meeting. As you are probably aware, we received an informational bulletin (attached) from CMS on May 9th that changed 3/17/19 as the deadline for full compliance with the new federal regulations – to the deadline for final approval of the CQS/STP. 3/17/2022 becomes the new date to demonstrate full compliance. This gives us a bit more time to complete our provider assessments, validation activities, and document any corrective action plans. In addition, we get a bit more time to think about how ongoing monitoring and compliance fits in with our current practice.

This item segues nicely into the next – as we need to develop a work plan to help us get from current state to final approval. CMS has proposed a set of milestones and end dates for this work (attached). The task at hand is for us to agree on the milestones and propose realistic end dates. Please take some time to do this between now and next meeting. We have some time after the 2019 deadline to worry about developing a full compliance work plan.

Next, I wanted to share the HCBS provider survey response rates with you and determine next steps.

Finally, I was going to let you know about the status of Vermont's geographic exception request – and discuss with you the current way Case Management and HCBS services are provided for each program in each of the geographic regions of the state. I wanted to have a conversation with you folks – before proposing a draft response to CMS.

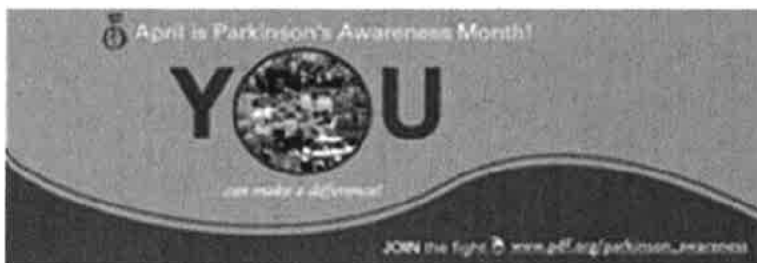

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As a recap, work has been done with various provider groups: Adult Day, Case Managers, Authorized Agencies for AFC, TBI to work together to integrate the HCBS rule language into the respective provider standards or policies/procedures. (DS has also done this with their network) These rules do not officially go into effect until 2019. The next step is for the various provider groups to complete a self assessment to determine where they need to strengthen compliance with the HCBS rules. When the self assessments are completed, there will be a validation of the assessments by way of interviewing the recipients/participants of the service providers. The compliance and practice of the HCBS rules will be ensured through quality reviews for each provider group.

Keep in mind that the HCBS rules do not apply to our Residential Care and Assisted Living Providers as they are not considered an HCBS setting by CMS. CMS identifies them as a PNMI- Private Non-Medical Institution. With this said philosophically we support the settings and person centered planning rules, so when we are able to re-open the regulations for these provider types, we can work with the providers to incorporate some of the rules into the regulations.

Some of you asked about resources for person centered planning, so you can start integrating/sharing elements of this practice with your waiver teams.

Below are links to information/resources for both person centered planning and settings rules. I also attached a document, as well. Happy reading and let me know if any questions come up for you.

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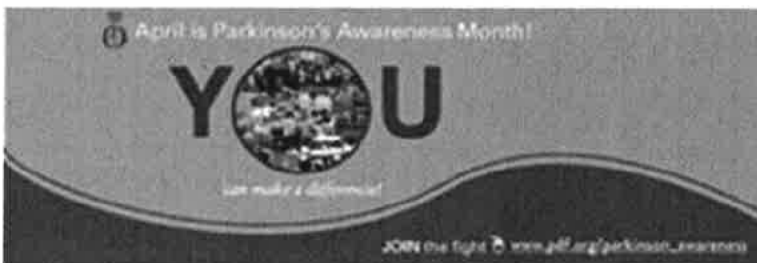
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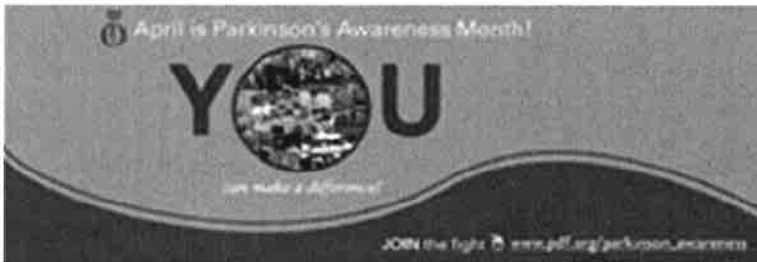

Attached you will see two pieces of legislation that were passed during the past legislative session, both of which we have discussed with the DAIL Advisory Board:

1. Act 125: An act relating to nursing home oversight: This is the act that will establish a working group to examine the oversight of nursing homes in Vermont, including financial stability and licensing criteria, in order to ensure the provision of high-quality services and a safe and stable environment for nursing home residents. **The DAIL Advisory Board needs to select one of its members to participate on this working group.** I've highlighted the language in the act that speaks to this. You'll see that the working group will need to submit a report on its findings and recommendations on or before January, 2019. As the Advisory Board thinks about who to appoint, I'd suggest that the advisory board look at the other individuals/groups that are already going to be represented and to try to appoint someone who will be distinct from the other identified members of the work group. I anticipate that meetings will be pretty regular (perhaps monthly) and will take place in Waterbury.

2. H. 608: An act relating to creating an Older Vermonters Act working group: This should have an act number very soon, the signing of the bill just took place today along with the signing of the Older Americans Month Proclamation. The purpose of this group is to develop recommendations for an Older Vermonters Act that aligns with the Federal Older Americans Act, the Vermont State Plan on Aging, and the Choices for Care Program. I've highlighted the language that calls on the DAAIL Advisory Board to **appoint 2 older Vermonters from different regions of the state as well as two family caregivers , "one of whom is a family member of an older Vermonter and one of whom is an informal provider of in-home and community care."** To be honest, we're a little unclear about what the difference is between the two family caregivers so are thinking things will work out fine if we just focus on finding two family caregivers. So, these people don't have to be DAAIL Advisory Board members, but I think technically they could be. Or, I am hoping some of you can reach out to some of the family caregivers you know and see if anyone is interested. The first meeting of this work group must occur before September 15 of this year (we are tentatively looking at **September 7**) and must report its recommendations to the General Assembly on or before December 1, 2019. I anticipate that meetings will take place in Waterbury and will probably be pretty regular (monthly or bi-monthly).

So, please be thinking about this in advance and I hope coming with some ideas about people that can fill these spots – both are great opportunities that should be pretty interesting!

In terms of other agenda items, we have:

I wanted to give you a bit more information about our May agenda:

APS Subcommittee: This is probably pretty self-explanatory, but the APS Subcommittee has been meeting for a few years now and Clayton Clark wants to discuss a proposal to develop Operating Procedures and to get any initial input you may have.

Please note that we anticipate that the time frames for the next 3 agenda items will probably be a bit "fluid" and we may end up spending more time than expected on what topic and less on another, but at least they are scheduled together so that we have that flexibility:

Summarize the SFY 18 Budget: Bill Kelly, DAIL's Financial Director, will join Commissioner Hutt and me to review the SFY 18 Budget. Following is an overview of topics that we will be covering:

1. National Core Indicators (NCI): June Bascom from DDSD and Megan Tierney-Ward from ASD will join us to discuss the NCI, which is a voluntary effort by states to measure and track their own performance. There are core indicators that are standard measures used across the participating states to assess the outcomes of services provided to individuals and families. DDSD has been participating in the NCI for Developmental Disabilities Services for a couple of years and ASD is gearing up for its first year of participation in the NCI for Aging and Disabilities Programs. June will share the preliminary results of the NCI DD for 2017 and Megan will talk about our plans for implementing the NCI AD.
2. Independent Living: Sarah Launderville from the Vermont Center for Independent Living (VCIL) will join us to talk about the Independent Living movement, help us to understand its importance and talk with us about how this explains why there are sometimes both similar and different perspectives across aging and disabilities. Sarah will also talk with us about some of the recent successes, challenges and priorities of VCIL as well as the Centers for Independent Living nationally. This topic was suggested by a former DAIL Advisory Board member.
3. Code of Ethics and Ethics Acknowledgement: Last week Camille sent out information to the advisory board following up on our previous conversations and requests related to the Executive Order Code of Ethics and required Acknowledgement for Appointees. We can have a brief conversation if people would like, and we hope that we can collect the signed Acknowledgements from members.




