Some examples of devices that may be available to look at include:

- The **Easi-Grip Garden Tools Set**. These tools have ergonomically angled handles to keep the hand and wrist in a natural position. This can help reduce stress on joints.
- **Toys**, such as a singing Olaf, that have been **switch adapted** with an accessible switch to operate them. This makes the toys accessible for those who can't use the original built in switch.
- **The Amazon Echo Show** and other devices for home control, accessing music, organization, and accessing the internet of things.
- A **one-handed cutting board** with features such as a clamp and pins to help secure food,

allowing the person to cut food using one hand.
