Working Group Operating Procedures

- At least 48 hours before a regular meeting (and 24 hours before a special meeting), DAIL
 will:

 - o make the agenda available upon request.
- DAIL will use its best efforts to distribute to members, at least 7 calendar days in advance of the scheduled meeting, the agenda and any identified materials to be referenced at the meeting.
