Some examples of devices that may be available to look at include:

- Two different size Hokki stools that turns stationary sitting into active sitting environments. The convex base allows for movement in all directions.
- Fidgets to help with concentration.
- Sensory items including D.I.Y sensory bottles and a weighted blanket.
- An Echo smart pen for taking both written and audio notes at the same time and creating a digital copy of them.
- A dictation program called Dragon Naturally Speaking that turns your speech into written text and has voice commands for controlling the computer.
